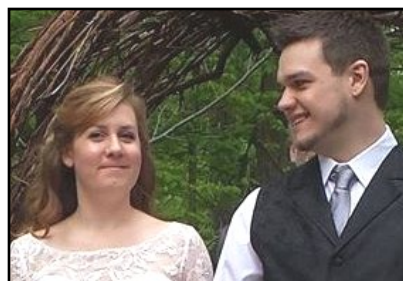

There will be no Children’s Church on June 1-June 15. Kids will sit with parents during the entire adult service. Busy Bags are available at the Welcome Center.

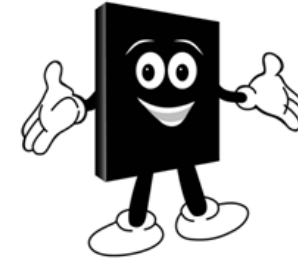
There will be no 9:00 AM classes for adults or children on July 6.

VCL Happenings

VCL's Read to Rescue Summer Program

Read to Rescue is a summer project for all of us at VCL. It's designed for kids and teens to read books and for adults to pledge and sponsor them. It is a giving campaign to support the ministry of She Is Safe and goes from June 1 to July 20.



Read to Rescue is designed specifically to engage children and teens, on an appropriate level, so they can learn about the issues of suffering kids and adults around the world and can do something to be an active part of the solutions. It is one of the official fundraisers for She Is Safe and our community-based SIS Chicago Advocacy Group.

This VCL program will be a collective fundraiser, with kids and teens joining to read as many books as possible and with adults and families combining their pledged sponsorship for all the books read. None of the kids or youth will ask VCL adults to sponsor them personally, but they can invite their families, relatives and friends outside of VCL to join our sponsorship program.

So kids and teens, please join Read to Rescue. Sign up at the Information Center and start reading. Ask your family, relatives, and friends to sponsor your reading to join the other VCL sponsors. You can choose any books you want to read or follow a suggested reading list. You can even get credit for each book of the Bible you and your family read during our all-church New Testament Reading Campaign. Younger kids can join, too. Three picture books that are read with the help of an adult or older sibling will equal one chapter book read by older kids. But wait! There's more. Prizes will also be awarded to the kids and teens who read the most books in their age categories!

VCL Adults and families, please be a sponsor and make a monetary pledge for Read to Rescue. See the chart below to choose the size of your pledge. We have more than 50 kids that may join the reading challenge, but there will only be a maximum of 200 books for you to sponsor. At the end of the Read to Rescue program on July 20, you will pay your pledge by check, written to She Is Safe, or by giving it in cash. VCL will combine all the cash and issue one VCL check to She Is Safe. (Note: She Is Safe is a registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit and will send you a tax deductible receipt as a charity donation, but a pledge paid in cash cannot receive a deductible receipt.)

Please choose the pledge level you want to give at as a collective sponsor and sign up at the Information Center:

- 10 cents per book = maximum of \$20 donation**
- 25 cents per book = maximum of \$50 donation**
- 50 cents per book = maximum of \$100 donation**
- \$ 1.00 per book = maximum of \$200 donation**

Mercy Fund Helps Our Former Missionaries

VCL supported Scott and Carol Kling-smith who were working in Austria until a few years ago when Carol’s struggles with MS brought them back home. Scott currently teaches at Denver Seminary in Colorado.

Last April we received word that Carol needed to be hospitalized for eight weeks. In the process, they realized that she would need a new wheelchair with sophisticated options to keep her healthy. VCL’s Mercy Fund contributed \$500 to assist in this purchase. Scott wrote, “The chair is allowing [Carol] to shift her weight around by tilting and adjusting her sitting angles. I cannot express strongly enough how moved we’ve been through the prayers and gifts and concern for us. In this very hard time it’s been incredible to experience God’s love for us through his people. You have encouraged and sustained us in ways we didn’t know were possible.”

Community Bible Study

Gaining Steam by Pastor Michael Mauiello

Have all the tweets, Facebook posts, emails, and pulpit announcements gotten your attention yet? I hope so, because on June 29, I want every adult in the congregation to plan on participating in Community Bible Experience (CBE). This Study provides a fantastic way to read the Bible. Biblica, formerly the International Bible Society, has test-driven CBE with over 300,000 people, and the results have been overwhelmingly positive.

By taking out all of the verse and chapter numbers, cross references, and notes, removing red letters and putting the text in a single column, they have slimmed down the thickness of the New Testament. And then, by rearranging the order of the books so they are more chronological, the Bible jumps to life! But the best part is the reading plan. By reading twelve pages every

day, five days a week, for eight weeks, you will have read the whole New Testament. But what is the fun of doing that all by yourself? Why not do it with everyone? Reading the Bible alone is difficult for many, many people. But if you read the Bible and then get together to talk about it, isn't that a better way of going through the New Testament in community?

Please plan to join us on Sunday, June 29. We will have a special First Hour Connection where we pass out the Bibles and get everyone oriented. I'm excited that Traci Crowley has agreed to emcee our mornings together. We'll take a week off over Fourth of July, but then, we'll start meeting every Sunday from July 13 to August 31.

Preaching and Worship Drawn from Our Community Bible Experience

As we planned our preaching for July and August we wanted to tie into the weekly reading we will all be doing through the New Testament. Pastor Michael helped me select a text for each Sunday, drawn from that week's reading, which highlights a key doctrine of our faith. We will study, for example, how Jesus fulfills the Old Testament promises, how the Holy Spirit gives us life, Christ's atonement, and several others. (The first part of the series is listed on the *Vine* flap.) Sermons in both print and audio formats are available at evcl.org/sermons.

As always, our worship services will be developed around themes drawn from each week's preaching texts. In addition, on some Sundays we will feature people telling us about their own Bibles and how they use them. We will have one Sunday featuring the ministry of the Gideons which Village Church has long supported. We'll help everyone learn the books of the New Testament by heart. And we'll hear testimonies of how reading the New Testament together is touching lives in our church.
